In his early years, Joseph found fun in adventuresome activities such as jumping off high bridges with no fear. Joseph used to say, "Face your Fears." He also found it challenging and fun to go to skateparks and pushed himself to get better each time, learning new tricks on his scooter. He made the tail-whip look good! 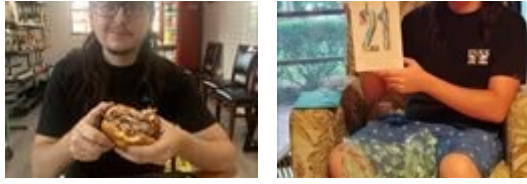

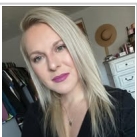
