Linda Margaret Fitzgerald Davis passed away quietly on a Thursday morning, October 6, 2022, at the Solace Center in Asheville, NC, at the age of 72. She succumbed to complications arising from the rapid onset of an aggressive form of brain cancer (GBM). All that knew her mourn the untimely loss of her strong spirit and her kind, gentle and loving nature.

Born in Monmouth, NJ, on May 2, 1950, she was the second of five children born to James Edward Fitzgerald† and Dorothy Marie Collet Fitzgerald†. Linda had many good friends who also share the grief at her passing. Whether they came to know her in recent years, have remained close after developing a lasting friendship while working together in years past, or

whether they have known her and kept her in their hearts for more than half a century now, she cherished every friendship and undoubtedly brought her own joy and light into each one.

Linda was a talented and enthusiastic gardener, artist and amateur photographer with a particular fondness for beautiful flowers, fascinating mushrooms, interesting insects and adorable animals. She loved nature, often taking long walks in the woods with friends and/or animal friends. She delighted in traveling to witness the wonders of nature and to visit friends and family as often as she could. In quieter moments, she enjoyed reading books and spending time chatting, looking through photos and records of family history, or watching television at home with her beloved husband.

Professionally, she excelled as a library technician at Bell Laboratories, NASA Langley Research Center, and Asheville-Buncombe Technical Community College from which she ultimately retired.

Linda, although you have now passed beyond this mortal coil and into the unknown, you will forever remain present in our hearts and minds. We will miss you always, but know that our lives have been made immeasurably better for having shared this time with you. For now, we will carry on in the hope that our paths shall meet again one day. Until that blessed day, may your spirit be free and find peace.
