



Robert Louis Devereaux

June 6, 1932 - April 14, 2026

Robert Louis Devereaux, 93, left this world quietly on April 14, 2026, at Trinity View senior living community in Arden, NC, where he had lived for the past ten years.

As he was known by his friends, "Bob" was born in Buffalo, NY on June 6, 1932. He married Elizabeth Ann Hoenig of Lockport, NY in 1956.

He served in the U.S. Air Force as an aircrew member and radio operator on B-29 bomber aircraft during the Korean War. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal, and a Purple Heart for heroism and meritorious service when his aircraft was shot down behind enemy lines.

Bob began a career with AT&T as a craftsman in the Long Lines division in 1959. He rose through the ranks, ending his career as President and Managing Director of AT&T Nordics in Stockholm, Sweden in 1989.

Bob and his wife retired in Asheville in 1993 where they were active volunteers at the Literacy Council and local schools. They enjoyed traveling extensively across the US and the world and they loved the Asheville dining and cultural scene.

Bob was a very enthusiastic and active resident at Trinity View. He was a

friend and advisor to residents and staff alike.

He was preceded in death by his beloved wife of 62 years, Betty Ann, in 2018. He is survived by their 5 children: Dr. Robert (Kitty) Devereaux of Charlottesville, VA, Major General Richard (Elizabeth) Devereaux, USAF (Ret.), of Asheville, NC, Donna Devereaux of Charlotte, NC, Mark (Amy) Devereaux of Mocksville, NC, Dr. Matthew (Meredith) Devereaux of Knoxville, TN; twelve grandchildren and eight great grandchildren (and two more on the way!) scattered across the US who were devoted to their “grandpa.”

There will be a memorial service at Trinity View Retirement Community at 1:00 PM Thursday, May 21, 2026, followed by inurnment in the columbarium at St. Eugene’s Catholic Church. In lieu of flowers, the family suggests a donation to a favorite charity in Bob’s name.
